The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recently translated two measles education materials into Ukrainian. The first is a fact sheet titled “Measles and the Vaccine (Shot) to Prevent It.” The second is an infographic titled “Measles: More than just a little rash.”

These education materials explain the signs and symptoms of measles, life-threatening complications from the disease, and how the disease is spread. The materials also provide information on why the MMR (measles-mumps-rubella) vaccine is recommended, when children should be vaccinated routinely or before travel with the MMR vaccine, and the safety and side effects of the vaccine.

These resources are intended for parents and childcare providers, and can be distributed in health clinics and other community settings (i.e., daycares, schools, and community centers).
